A SERIES of results, more in accordance with the book of form than some of them have been lately, added to the enjoyment of some splendid racing on a glorious day at Newmarket yesterday.

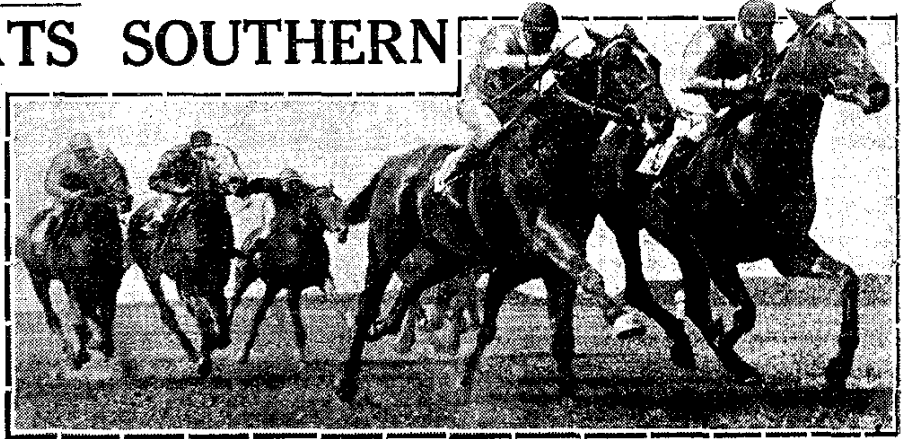
I must say that, like many others, I had my doubts as to the merit of Bright Bird's performance in the Vase after the failure of Bishop's Move at Carlisle.

beaten Grey but Gay. Lord Astor's filly raced in front, on the far side, and it was not until the last few strides that Lost Soul got up to beat her by a short head.

To-day's Hints Ormenus, a stable companion to Coroado, is to attempt to keep the northern flag flying in the Princess Stakes to-day, but I feel the task of conceding weight all round may be beyond him.

Vermeil II, in the same colours, should also give a good account of himself in the Fulbourne Stakes. Whether he can stop Red Biddy at the weights is quite another matter.

Clustine, from all accounts, has done well since Ascot, and that being the case, he might be good enough for the Waterbeach Handicap.

Likely Winners for Last Stage of Newmarket Meeting

NEWMARKET, Thursday. The programme at the final stage of our meeting to-morrow is a really good one, and it is safe to say that useful size fields face the starter in the majority of events.

The Ellesmere Stakes is the chief event. Misanthrope will miss it for the London Cup on Saturday, and Alexander will do duty for Egerton House.

The running of Homily in the Britannia Stakes at Ascot looks good enough to win this race, and I shall not look beyond him.

Mark Time, Highland Lament and Flying Orders are all more or less fancied for the Princess Stakes, and in choosing the last-named I do not think I shall be very wide of the mark.

FROM OTHER QUARTERS

Weyhill.—Armagnac (4.30) runs his races out much better now than he did at one time, and is sure to go close.

Beckhampton.—Lemnicus (4.0) is on the upgrade and is expected to win this time. Ogbourne.—Hidalgo (3.0) is fit and well and fancied at Newmarket.

LORD GLANELY'S JOCKEY

Steve Donoghue May Ride Colombo in the St. Leger

No jockey has yet been appointed to succeed W. R. Johnstone, whose contract with Lord Glanely has been dissolved by mutual consent.

Out of 127 mounts in England this season, Johnstone has ridden twelve winners. His last success was on Lord Glanely's Foxmasque, winner of the valuable Sandringham Foal Plate at Sandown Park.

Steve Donoghue was again busy yesterday contradicting rumours that he would retire from the saddle at the end of the season.

Donoghue said that Sir Victor Sassoon suggested he should retire at the end of this season and begin training for him at Newmarket.

"I feel so very well," he added, "and also I am riding, in my opinion, as well as ever, so that I am encouraged to believe that I ought to continue as a jockey."
