## Owners Draw Lots for a Plater TURN FOR QUY

A SERIES of results, more in accordance with the book of form than some of them have been lately, added to the enjoyment of some splendid racing on a glorious day at Newmarket yesterday. And the most popular of them all was the success of Bright Bird, who proved that Ascot form is not wholly unreliable by running away with the Princess of Wales's Stakes.

I must say that, like many others, I had my doubts as to the merit of Bright Bird's performance in the Vase after the failure of Bishop's Move at Carlisle. That apart, his big chance was obvious, and apparently the majority took him on his Ascot merit. Fox, who preferred to ride Lord Astor's colt in the Vase instead of Duplicate, who beat him, again had the mount, and he has not been on an easier big race winner for a long time.

#### Always in Front

Fox rode a waiting race on Bright Bird at Ascot, but the shorter distance now no doubt decided him to go all the way in an attempt to make the pull in the weights tell against the older horses. The tactics succeeded admirably. Making the turn on to the racecourse Lord Astor's colt was well clear of the remainder and keeping up a good gallop to the end never looked like being caught.

Black Devil and Valerius were always most prominent of the others, and in a short, sharp tussle for second place, Black Devil earned the £200 that went to the second by a head margin. Cotoneaster came from the rear to finish fourth, and although she never looked like winning it was a really good performance under a big weight. Young Lover was not saddled owing to the hard going

#### Sprint Champion

After Coroado's fine victory in the July Cup it looks as if he has well earned the distinction of being the best sprinter in training. True Myrobella was not in the field, but Solenoid, Greenore, Strathearron and Satyr are a nice troop of "speed merchants," and he treated them all with scant respect. As at Ascot, the Malton coft was ridden by Gunn so again it was a Northern triumph in every respect

Satyr, who is a very fast beginner, led the field for more than halfway, but Coroado was always going well, and drew out clear in the last furlong. Greenore came with a strong run in the last two furlongs to finish second after Strathcarron had looked like getting that place. Coroado has now won four races in succession. Last season he only won twice in fourteen attempts.

#### Another Claim

Claiming horses out of selling races is becoming much less rare than was once the case, and I must say that I am rather glad to see the change. The horse claimed yesterday was Community, who had started favourite and finished second to Deceptive in the Haughley Plate, and so many wanted her that it was necessary to draw lots. Mr. Cecil Langlands proved the lucky man, and the filly went to Epsom for 400 guineas—the advertised selling price of the winner plus the value of the stake. Sir Alfred Butt had to go to 740 guineas to keep Deceptive

Lord Derby's two-year-olds are still right out of touch with fortune. Few anticipated Fairhaven upsetting Alykhan in the Exeter Stakes, but he did appear the danger. Instead, Fairhaven finished last of four. Alykhan appeared to be under pressure at the end of five furlongs, but he ran on very gamely and won decisively in the end

Mark Time and Flying Orders, both good wirners last time out, should run well but with conditions favouring very speedy horses, I prefer Mumtaz Begum, who won so easily at Brighton.

Vermeil II, in the same colours, should also give a good account of himself in the Fulbourne Stakes. Whether he can stop Red Biddy at the weights is quite another matter, since the Stockbridge filly beat all save Caretta at Ascot.

Clustine, from all accounts, has done well since Ascot, and that being the case, he might be good enough for the Waterbeach Handicap. Capricho looks well placed in the Milton Handicap.
