AGA KHAN?

Pharian Likely to Score Under Big Weight

A RETURN to normal-sized fields cannot be expected immediately after rain, but it is safe to say that there will be many more runners at Newmarket this week than was the case a fortnight ago. But a close study of the programmes for the three days leaves the feeling that winners may not be so easy to find as they have been during the past week or two.

It should not be necessary to look beyond Hyperion in the Dullingham Stakes to-day, but he will be at odds prohibitive to the majority. Alcazar, with a big pull in the weights, may give him a bit of a race, but a mile and a half at Newmarket is Hyperion's ideal course, and there should be no need for Tommy Weston to get so busy as to lose another cap.

Zanoff Doubts

Bunker and Haytime will be other dangerous runners in Lord Derby's colours this afternoon. The latter goes for the Beaufort Stakes, but he does not strike me as particularly well treated with one or two others. Zanoff will be suited to the down hill finish, and if it was all on the slope I should doubt him being caught. But there is also a pretty stiff portion in this seven furlongs, and I think it will suit Pharian better than it will most of them.

Burning Sands, who cost Mrs. Corlette Glorney 910gs, after winning at Epsom, will again be ridden by Richards in the Saxham Stakes, and so easily did she win at Chepstow, subsequently, that she may not be out of her element in this rather more exalted company. At the same time I doubt that she will beat Flying Orders or Biscuit, the former of whom has proved his ability and has done well since joining J. Jarvis's stable.

Near the Century

The only runner from Beckhampton that can help Richards towards his near-at-hand century is Lemniscus. Lord Ellesmere's horse, from all accounts, is fully expected to improve on his form at the last meeting, but I do not see why he should turn the tables on Mumtaz Begum The Aga Khan's filly was a good way in front of him a fortnight ago, and the downhill finish to-day should be in her favour. Rosecrag is a likely one for a place.


Another likely winner for the Aga Khan is Bay Monk, who would have a bit more to do in a handicap than he has in the Spring Hall Plate. An interesting runner in this race would be Antic, a three-year-old from Foxhill, who, like his stable companion Playful, did not run as a juvenile. There is an excellent opportunity for anything at all useful in a rather moderate field, and I shall not be surprised if Antic is the one to bustle up the Aga Khan's colt.

Too Much Racing

I am afraid that Scotland is suffering at the present time from too much racing. It is only on rare occasions that good horses are

attracted over the border, and there are not even enough moderate to bad ones to satisfy the demands of the present over-crowded fix-ture list. At Ayr yesterday the racing was again very "thin," and one shudders to think what it would be like if Middleham trainers lacked enterprise.

The enthusiasm of Prince Aly Khan and Lord Carnarvon also helped yesterday. Chor Bazar was sent from Newmarket and Lumber Jack from Whatcombe for the Cuninghame Stakes, in which the latter had a 5lb, allowance because he was ridden by his owner. Lord Carnarvon's horse was a slightly better favourite than Chor Bazar and Komombo, but the pair were much too good for him, and Prince Aly Khan was in front all the way.

Irenicon Again

Irenicon had shown a liking for the course at the previous meeting, and took full advantage of the absence of Fugit to do so again in the Montrose Handicap. It was a little surprising to find Wardley a better favourite than the Lambourn three-year-old, who was really never in danger of defeat. * *

Night Arrow won a tame sort of race for the Castlehill Handicap and there was nothing in the Auchincruive Plate to get enthusiastic about—particularly for those who laid odds on the Middleham youngster Argyll. Peacock's colt was well beaten by the Edinburgh winner Young Penitent, who, judging by this latest performance, is pretty useful on the North country two-year-old standard.

He has, according to a Reuter New York message, informed the Madison-square Garden Corporation, through his manager, that he "chose not to defend his title" this autumn. Baer's action was not unexpected, his manager having indicated that the champion was making too much money out of the show business and proposed movie contracts to bother with any more fighting during 1934.

Colonel Kilpatrick, a member of the corporation, is expected to announce a series of eliminnation contests for challengers.

Jimmy Johnston, the Madison-square Garden matchmaker, states that he intends to invite Steve Hamas, Carnera, Art Lasky and the winner of the Neusel-Schmeling contest to form the first division of the challenging squad.
