ONE more Summer Cup victory at Liverpool and we shall have to christen Johnny Dines the "Brown Jack of Aintree." This pocket hercules among jockeys finished first for the fifth year in succession yesterday when Gay Dancer proved just too good for Coton-easter, though actually he has won the race only four times as China Fing was disqualified in favour of Zane Grey in 1932.

Diamantee, on which Dines scored last year, and finished second to Leighon in the spring, now took a further backward step, but for all that was still too good for the much-fancied Snooker. I had my doubts about this mile and a quarter being quite within the compass of Mr. J. B. Joel's horse and another arises as to whether he is really in love with the game.

Came from Behind

Fast-finishing horses coming from behind often appear unlucky, but Gay Dancer finished so strongly that he would probably have held off Cotoneaster's final effort had that been made earlier. Cotoneaster was last of the small troop until reaching the final bend, and accepting the result as it stands in cold print it was a good performance on her part to give the three-year-old 22lb, and such a good race.

Foxbridge won the valuable Atlantic Cup here a year ago, but unless he mends his ways we shall begin to wonder whether the records are speaking the truth. Last in the early stages, he put in a spectacular burst almost to catch the pacemaking Jack Grange half-way up the straight, and apparently thinking that he had done enough gave it up and finished among the also rans.

Two for Richards

Dines was in an even closer finish for the Croxteth Plate on the Irish colt Veneagle, this time against his particular pal Gordon Richards on the very game Tetrapod. As was the case in the Cup, Dines got first run, but spurred by the knowledge that he had not ridden a winner for three days, Richards put in some great work in the last 100 yards and was rewarded by a short-head victory literally in the last stride. Fugit was making up ground at the finish, and her turn should come again before the season is much further advanced.

A few inches also sufficed to give Richards his second winner and the Aga Khan yet another of the Turf's big prizes—the Atlantic Cup. After his good display in the Eclipse Stakes Alishah was an automatic favourite, but the improved Monkshood showed that he was anything but a good thing by making him fight to the very last ditch. Flamenco, saved for a late run, found the task of conceding 10lb well beyond him.

Hurst Mix-Up

Six runners—which did not include Annihilation—crowded plenty of "incident" into the Lambton Plate at Hurst Park. Only five were left when Happy Manmore refused to gallop, and after the swerving Great Dane had beaten Swoon the second objected to the winner and Perryman, who was third on Hill Song, objected to the pair of them. The stewards sorted it all out by disqualifying Great Dane, awarding the race to Swoon and over-ruling Perryman's complaint. * * *

Red Queen, who has had a long and chequered career, brought off the biggest surprise at either meeting in the Earlsfield Handicap.
