VALKYRIE UPSET

TWO very tired horses fought out the finish of the Goodwood Cup yesterday. They were Loosestrife and Hill Song, and because the former possessed the better stamina, he managed to wipe out his failure on the previous day to give Gordon Richards his first success at the meeting on the outsider in a field of four.

With the exception of the tailed-off Happy Manmore, Loosestrife had finished last behind Claran—a performance that greatly disappointed Miss Norah Wilmot, who controls the Binfield Grove stable. She had expected him to win both the Stakes and the Cup, but after his first failure all confidence for yesterday's race evaporated. From the betting sense he was left entirely alone by the stable and by most other people for that matter.

Stamina Tells

The race was run at a much better pace than is usually the case in these small fields. Taking advantage of his pull in the weights, E. Smith set a good gallop from the start and, followed by Hill Song and Loosestrife in that order Her Eminence was still in front until well into the straight. With two furlongs to go, the filly had had enough, and Hill Song took her place. In turn his stamina gave out, and although edging to the centre of the course, Loosestrife managed to go fast enough to beat Lady Ludlow's unlucky horse by three lengths.

Loosestrife's victory completed a nice hattrick for the bookmakers, whose experiences on the first two days had left them wondering whether Goodwood was really glorious. They had few doubts on the subject when Foxmasque won the Craven Stakes, and none at all when Artistic upset Valkyrie, but the views changed when the last three favourites, including the once 'doubtful' Bahram again sent the pendulum swinging against them

All the Way

When Johnstone scored on Foxmasque at Sandown recently, he took the lead from the start and never looked like being caught. Arthur Wragg copied those tactics to the letter yesterday, and although Amoretto came with a promising run near the finish, Foxmasque still had a bit in hand to ward off the danger. Abbots Last started favourite, but never looked like turning the bad luck that dogs Beckhampton at the moment. Perhaps Caretta will do so to-day. so to-day.

Artistic's victory in the Singleton Handicap was also of the "all the way" variety, even if it was not gained in such decisive fashion. Well drawn, the filly had all the best of the start, and, although Valkyrie and March Tor reduced the gap in the last furlong, they found the winning post too near. Nick the Greek carried the Figaro colours prominently, and will no doubt do the stable another turn in the near future.

St. Oswald's Pluck

St. Oswald won the Drayton Handicap simply because he refused to be beaten. First Earlston, then Pharian, and finally Tartan did their best to peg him back, but each was beaten off in turn for a well-deserved victory in which Perryman played a big part. Hat Guard was close up behind the placed horses, and on this form his turn should come shortly.

Bahram won the Rous Memorial Stakes in Banram won the Rous Memorial stakes in much the same fashion as he had upset his stable companion, Theft in that big Sandown surprise. For the greater part of the journey he was led by Racla colt, True Tilda and Battle Note, but as soon as Fox asked for an effort Bahram went right through with one run to score with more in hand than the neck verdict might suggest.

Colorado Kid defied a big weight when he won the Chesterfield Cup a year ago, and from all accounts the American horse Mate is quite expected to do so to-day. Another with a big burden expected to run well is Light Sussex, but neither may give the weight to Solfatara, who impressed me as a future winner when she finished right on top of the placed horses in the Royal Hunt Cup. Statesman, Highlander and Alcazar will help to make it a fine race.

Eagleray will take a lot of catching if Nicoll can get him off with the rest in the Chichester Stakes, but as he often handicaps himself at the start I fear to trust him. Flying Spear II, Tetrapylon, Hardy and Bidou should all like this fast course, and none, perhaps, better than Bidou, who caused such a big surprise when upsetting Osman Pasha here a year ago.

With a nice pull in the weights La Gaiete and L.L.O. filly may make Caretta go all the way in the Molecomb Stakes, but I doubt if either will beat Lord Lonsdale's brilliant filly. Apollo will probably start favourite for the Findon Stakes, but I prefer Veldschoen, who will know more about the game than he did at Hurst Park last week.
