A BECKHAMPTON STABLE EXPECTED TO DO WELL AT DERBY

Windsor Lad Dries Up Leger Betting PEGOMAS AGAIN

By BOUVERIE BOOKMAKERS are finding it difficult work to arouse any real betting interest in the St. Leger. Even the novelty of special place odds for half a dozen of Windsor Lad's rivals did not alter the usual story of little doing at yesterday's call over. When it is all over I shall not be surprised to hear that there has been less betting on the race than any St. Leger of recent years.

Lo Zingaro was "easier" than he had been at the previous call over, but that does not mean a weakening of the hopes in the Beckhampton colt. Naturally, those who regard him as the big danger to Windsor Lad wish to wait and see how he fares in his final test at Derby to-morrow. Primero is also engaged, and even if he stays away it will still be a good trial for Lo Zingaro with the much improved Hoplite a certain runner.

Luck Turning? Like one or two other "fashionable" stables, Beckhampton has had a lean time so far this season, but there are signs of revival at Derby this week. Havelock broke the ice, so to speak, with a narrow win at Gatwick, and it is hoped that his example will be copied by several of his stable companions in addition to Lo Zingaro during the next three days.

One of them is Ben Marshall, who goes for the valuable Breeders' Foal Plate this afternoon, though I must say that I should have thought more of his chance with Eppie Adair colt out of the way. Still I am not forgetting that he was being spoken of as a Derby possible before Goodwood, and as five furlongs should suit him better than six, he is certainly a big danger to Sir Abe Bailey's unbeaten colt.

Chief Hopes Cape Race, in the Byrkeley Nursery, is another youngster expected to go close, but probably greater hopes centre in Sudbury for the Hartington Handicap to-day and Lemnicus and Berebos later in the week. A Friary Nursery looks a bit strange with only ten acceptors, and it would not be surprising to learn that Lemnicus was the one that frightened the others away.

At first glance Sudbury appears to have quite enough weight, but he has earned it by his recent performances. A staying—and improving—three-year-old takes a lot of stopping at this time of the season, of which fact we have plenty of evidence in the successes of Alcazar and several others recently.

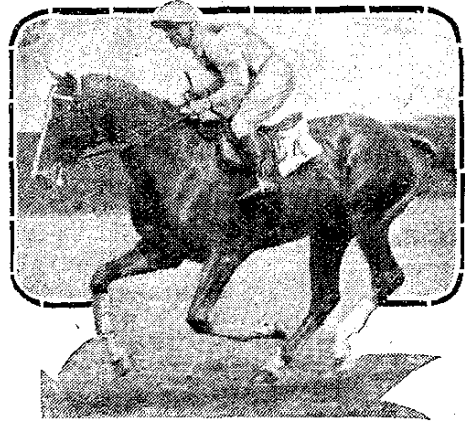
They Chose Right Picking the right race for a horse which has more than one immediate engagement is not always so easy as it might appear. But Mr. Cottrell did so when he allowed Radley Wood to miss Gatwick for Lewes, and so did Prince Aly Khan when he chose the Rothschild Plate instead of the longer race in which the colt was also engaged yesterday.

Pegomas has now won four races off the reel for his very enthusiastic young owner, and as he has never been extended there is no means of gauging his true worth. Frank Butters has no fewer than nine horses in the Cambridge-shire, and I must say that I shall be more interested in the weight given to Pegomas than in the handicapper's treatment of the others.

Mr. A. S. Boxall, a North London estate agent, who trains a few horses at Epsom as a

hobby and rides them whenever the occasion permits, caused a surprise in the other amateurs' race. With Pegomas out of the way and Duncanshaw waiting for a later engagement, the race looked "good" for Lord Carnarvon's mount Jack, but Alley led them all from start to finish to beat the favourite cleverly.

Seven furlongs at Epsom is generally regarded as the ideal course for Zanoff, so it was at bit of a surprise to see him going faster than Radley Wood at the end of a mile in the Newhaven Handicap. In the circumstances it was probably lucky for the favourite that he got first run when Bridge Fiend was beaten. Young Native found the weight too much, but Canaletto ran well and may give Weston a winning ride before he parts from Stanley House.

Mr. R. L. Joliffe bought Clematis for 330gn. after the filly had won a selling race for Lord Derby at Newmarket in July, and won the Fillies Nursery with her at the first attempt. Apparently Clematis had done well since being at Epsom, for there was every evidence in the ring that she was strongly fancied, and she scored in a manner suggesting that she will win again.

FROM THE STABLES

NEWMARKET, Monday. We shall not have many runners at Derby and Lewes to-morrow, but there should be several winners among those under orders to run.

The Jesuit, a runner in the Champion Breeders' Foal Plate at Derby, shaped very well in his gallop on Saturday, but I doubt that he will be good enough to beat Hilla, who is at the top of her form just now.

We may also supply the winner of the Byrkeley Nursery in the consistent Bendix, who will appreciate this fast course.

At Lewes Graceful Lad and Mumtaz Begum may have the finish of the Larnach Plate between them. Both are pretty useful, but on this course I prefer Graceful Lad, who has run well in better company than he meets to-morrow.

FROM OTHER QUARTERS Beckhampton.—Sudbury (3.30) should win at Derby, and Ben Marshall (3.0) and Cape Race (4.0) are well fancied each way. Weyhill.—Armagnac (3.0) is expected to win at Lewes.

Bishop's Cannings.—Pamplona c (2.0) has done well lately, and is thought to have an outstanding chance. Lambourn.—Under orders for Derby, Eppie Adair colt (3.0) and Lordling (4.0) both well fancied.

Middleham.—Left for Derby: Nimble Star filly (2.0) and Sarrasin (4.30) fancied each way.
