BOOKMAKERS are finding it difficult work to arouse any real betting interest in the St. Leger. Even the novelty of special place odds for half a dozen of Windsor Lad's rivals did not alter the usual story of little doing at yesterday's call over. When it is, all over I shall not be surprised to hear, that there has been less betting on the race than any St. Leger of recent years.

Lo Zingaro was "easier" than he had been at the previous call over, but that does not mean a weakening of the hopes in the Beckhampton colt. Naturally, those who regard him as the big danger to Windsor Lad wish to wait and see how he fares in his final test at Derby to-morrow. Primero is also engaged, and even if he stays away it will still be a good trial for Lo Zingaro with the much improved Hoplite a certain runner.

Luck Turning?

Like one or two other "fashionable" stables, Beckhampton has had a lean time so far this season, but there are signs of revival at Derby this week. Havelock broke the ice, so to speak, with a narrow win at Gatwick, and it is hoped that his example will be copied by several of his stable companions in addition to Lo Zingaro during the next three days

One of them is Ben Marshall, who goes for the valuable Breeders' Foal Plate this afternoon, though I must say that I should have thought more of his chance with Eppie Adair colt out of the way. Still I am not forgetting that he was being spoken of as a Derby possible before Goodwood, and as five furlongs should suit him better than six, he is certainly a big danger to Sir Abe Bailey's unbeaten colt.

Chief Hopes

Cape Race, in the Byrkley Nursery, is another youngster expected to go close, but probably greater hopes centre in Sudbury for the Hartington Handicap to-day and Lemniscus and Berebos later in the week. A Friary Nursery looks a bit strange with only ten acceptors, and it would not be surprising to learn that Lemniscus was the one that frightened the others away.


At first glance Sudbury appears to have quite enough weight, but he has earned it by his recent performances. A staying—and improving—three-year-old takes a lot of stopping at this time of the season, of which fact we have plenty of evidence in the successes of Alcazar and several others recently.

They Chose Right



Pegomas has now won four races off the reel for his very enthusiastic young owner, and as he has never been extended there is no means of gauging his true worth. Frank Butters has no fewer than nine horses in the Cambridgeshire, and I must say that I shall be more interested in the weight given to Pegomas than in the handicapper's treatment of the others.
