If Lo Zingaro is to have the ghost of a chance in the St. Leger the tide must turn to-day since Primero is a non-starter for the Breeders' Leger, and it has been decided not to give Hoplite another race so soon after his strenuous fight with Alishah at York.

The Best Thing?

Call Bell, Lemniscus and Reveille are other runners from the stable, and I shall be very disappointed if the first-named at least does not give Richards a winning ride.

Present arrangements are that The Trend gelding goes for the Harrington Plate in preference to a race at Brighton, and that being the case he should be too good for Reveille and the rest.

Unlucky Come-Back

G. Nicoll had his first ride since his accident at Windsor on Eppie Adair colt in the Breeders' Foal Plate at Derby yesterday, and although his mount might not have beaten Annabel in any case, he would certainly have been close up with better luck in running.

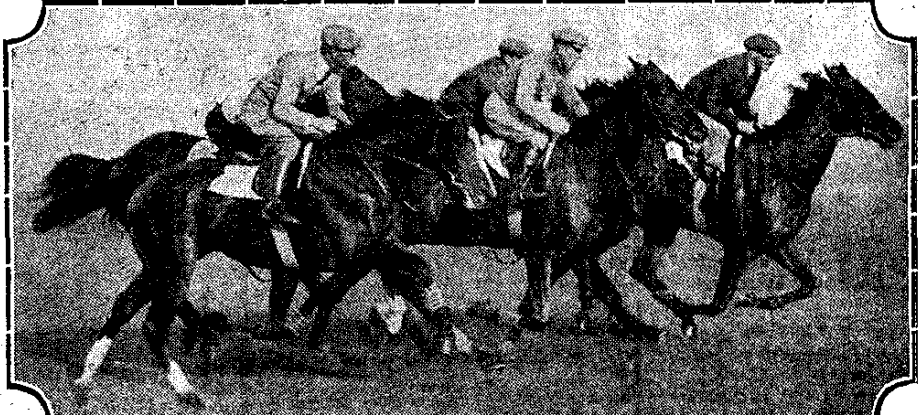
Annabel—a daughter of the speedy Arabella—showed much promise early in the season, but I believe she is rather a fretful sort away from home.

Lewes is Andy's happy hunting ground with a vengeance. The old fellow, who is now eleven years of age, has been winning races on the Sussex downs since 1926, and in seven years has scored eight times in fourteen attempts.

The handicapper's task would be delightfully simple if horses "ran to the ounce" as did Armagnac and Hush Hush in the September Handicap. On their form at the last meeting, when Hush Hush won by a head, they were handicapped to run a dead heat, and that is

Light o' Love has a chance to show the value of the "horses for courses" theory at Brighton to-day. Mr. Glasspool's colt always shows his best form on left-handed tracks of a sharp character, and in the corresponding race last year beat all except the smart Stop Gap.

Suspicion, an even greater course specialist, appears to be booked for another victory in the Kemp Town Plate, and her stable companion, Quickly, may end a luckless sequence by winning the Beach Plate.
