TWO LENGTHS VICTORY IN THE BIG DOUBLE

THE ST. LEGER

Places for Tiberius and Lo Zingaro RECORD EQUALLED

WELL, that £50,000 has been well spent. Windsor Lad may not have won the St. Leger in the spectacular fashion many expected him to do, but he won right enough, and was never in danger of defeat after he had resisted that very determined stickler Tiberius, who must have made Smirke really anxious for quite a long time.

The only thing that went wrong with general anticipation was the failure of Umidwar to get a place. As the race was run he had a wonderful chance of showing that he was really a danger to Windsor Lad, but he failed to last out the gallop, and was done with more than a quarter of a mile from home. Lo Zingaro secured third place chiefly because he possesses better stamina than those behind him, but for all his prominence at the finish I am still wondering about his courage.

At that point, Windsor Lad had moved up into third place, and as they came to the straight only Tiberius remained to be caught. Somebody shouted, "Get ready to cheer," and when the favourite drew alongside the leader soon after reaching the straight it did appear all over. But there was still a thrill or two to come. Tiberius carried on with the greatest gameness, and fully two furlongs out Smirke, who had been riding with supreme confidence, found it necessary to feel for his whip.

For the next fifty yards Smirke rode with all the fire that is in him, and his gallant mount did the rest. Gradually Tiberius had to give way to his master, and, kept going to the end, Windsor Lad went on to go down in the annals of Turf history as the first horse to win the Derby, Great Yorkshire Stakes and St. Leger, in covering the course in 3m. 13.5s. Windsor Lad equalled the record set up by Coronach in 1926.

Mr. Benson was naturally hugely delighted with his great good fortune. Nearly £10,000 in stake money, and, it is said, some nice bets, wipe out probably half the £50,000 it cost to buy Windsor Lad, who at the end of it all is the best classic bargain for years. Windsor Lad may still offend the eye of the ultra critical, but he has speed, stamina, and abundance of pluck—and what more can be required in a racehorse?

No doubt we shall hear loud excuses for Umidwar, and one or two of the others who "must have done better" had the ground not been so hard. Possibly Achten was the one most handicapped by the cast-iron going, and still I shall never expect to see him beat Windsor Lad under any conditions.

Windsor Lad's Victim Though the big race did not appeal so much as usual as a betting proposition, there were many other opportunities in the programme, but backers were badly off the mark in making Irongrey favourite for the Cleveland Handicap.

Irongrey was runner-up to Windsor Lad at York, but he now failed to finish in the first three. Below the distance Steve Donoghue made his effort on Blackmail, and he easily held off Flamenco to win by three parts of a length.

Following Windsor Lad's triumph, Debrett led all the way in the Bradgate Park Nursery, Tommy Weston rode a strong finish to win the Tattersall Sale Stakes on Bunker, and Blank won the Rufford Abbey Handicap after a desperate race by a short head. Veldschoen was favourite for Bunker's race, but after being in front a furlong out he weakened, and was beaten into third place.

To-day's Pointers

Hard going is quite likely to keep away several intended runners again to-day, but it is unlikely to affect the size of the field for the Portland Handicap to any extent. Apart from the prize there is always the chance of a bet at nice odds, and such opportunity with a strong market is not one to be missed. Our old friend, Figaro, is to attempt to add to his Goodwood victory, and other speed merchants to face the starter are Greenore, Rosemary's Pet, Faria, Furrokh Siyar and Bidou.

Nothing will surprise me less than another victory for Figaro, but at the altered weights he may not confirm the Goodwood places with Clustine, who runs in preference to Gold Bridge. Lord Beatty's grey was not far behind the placed horses in the Stewards' Cup, and to-day he receives 12lbs. instead of 3lb. as was the case at Goodwood. Bidou should prove the best of the light-weights, and might be the best one for a place.

Overall, with G. Richards, will be a popular fancy for the Alexandra Handicap. He was a clever winner at Windsor, but the going was better there than it will be to-day, and for this reason I prefer Venery, and the latter's stable companion. The Old Pretender, may complete a double for Mr. James de Rothschild by winning the Wharfedale Handicap, especially as Richards has been engaged to ride. Sevrier, who made a favourable impression in his first race at Goodwood, has a nice chance of opening his winning account in the Rous Plate.
